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EMPOWERING RURAL DEVELOPMENT THROUGH SOCIAL GREEN ENTREPRENEURSHIP TRAINING

WEGREEN project aims to bridge the "gap" in the educational system between the need for green and entrepreneurial skills and the lack of adequate educational content for the development of such skills, through an innovative training course for teachers in delivering social entrepreneurship green utilizing blended education, learning methodology. To this end, PR2 involves the development of the capacity building programme for formal and non-formal educators working with women in rural areas, based on the needs' analysis and the relevant findings of the research conducted within PR1.

As a first step, the partnership identified the main skeleton of the capacity building programme and then, according to the expertise of each organization the relevant allocation of the training modules has been done. In particular, the following modules were identified and developed:

- Module 1: Green Skills
- Module 2: Social Entrepreneurship
- Module 3: Soft Skills

• Module 4: Adult training techniques and best practices for upskilling women in rural areas in the field of green skills, social entrepreneurship and soft skills.

In parallel with the development of the training material, BK Con, as the lead partner of this PR, developed the learning platform in which, there will be uploaded all the modules and it will be freely available for anyone that is interested to get upskilled in the above mentioned topics.
